**INVESTMENT POLICY**  
**BEAVERCREEK TOWNSHIP, GREENE COUNTY, OHIO**

In accordance with Section 135.14(O) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Board of Trustees of Beaver Creek Township, Greene County, Ohio, hereby adopt the following Investment Policy effective as of the 29th day of February, 2016.

**I. SCOPE**

This investment policy applies to all monies of the Township, including state and federal funds held by the Township.

**II. POLICY STATEMENT**

It is the policy of Beaver Creek Township, Greene County, Ohio ("the Township") to deposit and invest public funds in a manner which will provide the maximum security with the highest investment return while meeting the daily cash flow demands of the Township and conforming to all state statutes governing the investment of public funds.

**III. PRUDENCE**

Deposit and investment of Township funds shall be made with the exercise of that degree of judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the probable safety of their capital as well as the probable income to be derived.

The standard of prudence to be used by the Fiscal Officer shall be the "prudent person" standard and shall be applied in the context of managing the overall portfolio. Acting in accordance with the investment policy and exercising due diligence shall relieve the Fiscal Officer of personal responsibility of an individual security's credit risk or market price changes, provided deviations from expectations are reported to the Board of Trustees on a timely basis and appropriate action is taken to control adverse developments.

#### **IV. ETHICS AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST**

Persons involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with the proper execution of the investment program or which may impair their ability to make impartial investment decisions. Employees and investment consultants shall disclose to the Board of Trustees any material financial interest in the financial institutions that conduct business with the Township and any large personal financial or investment positions that could be related to, or affected by, the performance of the Township's portfolio. All employees, officers and investment consultants of the Township shall subordinate their personal investment transactions to those of the Township particularly with regard to the timing of purchases and sales.

#### **V. AUTHORIZED FINANCIAL INSTITUTION AND DEALERS**

Only those institutions which have been selected by the Board of Trustees in accordance with the procedures set forth in Chapter 135 of the Ohio Revised Code shall be eligible to be public depository of Township funds. In making investments authorized by this policy, the Fiscal Officer may retain the services of an investment adviser, provided the investment adviser is licensed by the Division of Securities under Section 1707.141 of the Ohio Revised Code or is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, and possesses experience of public funds investment management, specifically in the area of state and local government investment portfolios or the advisers and eligible institutions mentioned in Section 135.03 of the Ohio Revised Code.

#### **VI. INVESTMENT OF INTERIM FUNDS**

The Fiscal Officer may invest or deposit any part or all of the "interim monies" of the Township. For the purpose of this policy, the term "interim funds" shall have the same meaning as set forth in Section 135.01(F). The following classifications of obligations shall be eligible for such investment or deposit:

1. United States treasury bills, notes, bonds, or any other obligation or security issued by the United States Treasury or any other obligation guaranteed as to principal and interest by the United States;

Nothing in the classification of eligible obligations set forth in division (B)(1) of this section or in the classifications of eligible obligations set forth in divisions (B)(2) to (7) of this section shall be construed to authorize any investment and striped principal or interest obligations of such eligible obligations.

2. Bonds, notes, debentures or any other obligations or securities issued by

any federal government agency or instrumentality including, but not limited to, the Federal National Mortgage Association, Federal Home Loan Bank, Federal Farm Credit Bank, Federal Home Loan Mortgage Corporation, Government National Mortgage Association, and Student Loan Marketing Association. All federal agency securities shall be direct issuances of federal government agencies or instrumentalities;

3. Interim deposits in the eligible institutions applying for interim monies as provided in Section 135.08 of the Revised Code. The award of interim deposits shall be made in accordance with Section 135.09 of the Revised Code and the Fiscal Officer shall determine the periods for which such interim deposits are to be made and shall award such interim deposits for such periods, provided that any eligible institution receiving an interim deposit award may, upon notification that the award has been made, decline to accept the interim deposit in which event the award shall be made as though the institution had not applied for such interim deposit;

4. Bonds and other obligations of the State of Ohio;

5. No-load money market mutual funds consisting exclusively of the obligations described in division (B)(1) or (2) of this section and repurchase agreements secured by such obligations, provided that investments and securities described in this division are made only through eligible institutions mentioned in Section 135.03 of the Ohio Revised Code;

6. The Ohio Subdivisions Fund as provided in Section 135.45 of the Revised Code;

7. Up to 25% of interim monies available for investment in either of the following:

A. Commercial paper notes issued by an entity defined in division (D) of Section 1705.01 of the Revised Code and that have assets exceeding \$500 million, to which notes all of the following apply:

- (1) The notes are rated at the time of purchase in the highest classification established by at least two nationally recognized standard rating services;
- (2) The aggregate value of the notes does not exceed 10% of the aggregate value of outstanding commercial paper of the issuing corporation;
- (3) The notes mature not later than 180 days after purchase.

- B. Bankers acceptance of banks that are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and to which both of the following apply:
- (1) Obligations are eligible for purchase by the federal reserve system;
  - (2) The obligations mature not later than 180 days after purchase.

No investment shall be made pursuant to division (B)(7) of this section unless the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees has completed additional training for making the investments authorized by division (B)(7) of this section. The type and amount of additional training shall be approved by the Auditor of State and may be conducted by or provided under the supervision of the Auditor of State.

- C. Nothing in the classifications of eligible obligations set forth in divisions (B)(1) to (7) shall be construed to authorize any investment in a derivative and the Fiscal Officer shall not invest in any derivative. For purposes of this division, a derivative has the same meaning as defined in Section 135.14(C) of the Ohio Revised Code;
- D. Except as provided in division (E) of this section, any investment made pursuant to this section must mature within five (5) years from the date of settlement unless the investment is matched to a specific obligation or debt of the Township;
- E. Written repurchase agreements with any eligible institution mentioned in section 135.03 of the Revised Code or any eligible dealer pursuant to division (M) of section 135.14 of the Revised Code under the terms of which agreement the Board of Trustees or Fiscal Officer purchases, and such institution or dealer agrees unconditionally to repurchase any of the securities listed in divisions (B)(1) to (5) of section 135.14 of the Revised Code, except letter of credit described in division (B)(2) of section 135.18 of the Revised Code. The market value of securities subject to an overnight written repurchase agreement must exceed the principal value of the overnight written repurchase agreement by at least two percent (2%). A written repurchase agreement shall not exceed thirty (30) days and the market value of securities subject to a written repurchase agreement must exceed the principal value of the written repurchase agreement by at least two percent (2%) and be marked to

market daily . All securities purchased pursuant to this division shall be delivered into the custody of an agent designated by the Board of Trustees or Fiscal Officer. A written repurchase agreement with an eligible securities dealer shall be transacted on a daily versus payment basis. The agreement shall contain the requirement that for each transaction pursuant to the agreement the participating institution or dealer shall provide all of the following information:

- (1) The par value of the securities;
- (2) The type, rate, and maturity of the securities;
- (3) A numerical identifier generally accepted in the securities industry that designates the securities;

Neither the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees shall enter into a written repurchase agreement under the terms of which the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees agrees to sell securities owned by the Township to a purchaser and agrees with that purchaser to unconditionally repurchase those securities.

- F. Neither the Fiscal Officer nor the Board of Trustees shall make an investment unless the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees, at the time of making the investment, reasonably expects that the investment can be held until its maturity;
- G. Neither the Fiscal Officer nor the Board of Trustees shall pay interim monies into a fund established by another subdivision, treasurer, governing board or investing authority, if that fund was established for the purpose of investing the public monies of other subdivisions. However, this division does not apply to the payment of public monies into either of the following:
  - (1) The Ohio Subdivisions Fund pursuant to division (B)(6) of this section;
  - (2) A fund created solely for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, owning, leasing or operating municipal utilities pursuant to the authority provided under Section 715.02 of the Revised Code or Section 4 of Article XVIII, Ohio Constitution.

- H. The use of leverage, in which the treasurer or governing board uses its current investment assets as collateral for the purpose of purchasing other assets, is prohibited. The issuance of taxable notes for the purpose of arbitrage is prohibited. Contracting to sell securities that have not yet been acquired by the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees, for the purpose of purchasing such securities on the speculation that bond prices will decline, is prohibited;
- I. Whenever, during a period of designation, the Fiscal Officer classifies public monies as interim monies, the Fiscal Officer shall notify the Board of Trustees of such action. The notification shall be given within thirty (30) days after such classification and in the event the Board of Trustees does not concur in such classification or in the investments or deposits made under this section, the Board of Trustees may order the Fiscal Officer to sell or liquidate any such investments or deposits and any such order shall specifically describe the investments or deposits and fix the date upon which they are to be sold or liquidated. Investments or deposits so ordered to be sold or liquidated shall be sold or liquidated for cash by the Fiscal Officer on the date fixed in such order at the then current market price. Neither the Fiscal Officer nor members of the Board of Township Trustees shall be held accountable to any loss occasioned by sales or liquidation of investments or deposits at prices lower than their cost. Any loss or expense incurred in making such sales or liquidations is payable as other expenses of the office of the Fiscal Officer;
- J. If any investments or deposits purchased under the authority of this section are issuable to a designated payee or to the order of a designated payee, the name of the Fiscal Officer and the title of the Fiscal Officer shall be so designated. If any such securities are registerable, either to principal or interest, or both, then such securities shall be registered in the name of the Fiscal Officer as such;

### **Safekeeping of Investment Documents**

The Fiscal Officer is responsible for the safekeeping of all documents evidencing the deposit or investment acquired by the Fiscal Officer. Any securities may be deposited for safekeeping with a qualified trustee as provided in Section 135.18 of the Ohio Revised Code. Interest earned on any investments or deposits authorized by this section shall be collected by the Fiscal Officer and credited by the Fiscal Officer to the proper fund of the Township;

- K. All investments, except for investments in securities described in divisions (B)(5) and (6) of this section, shall be made only through a member of the National Association of Security Dealers, through a bank, savings bank, or savings and loan association regulated by the Superintendent of Financial Institutions, or through an institution regulated by the comptroller of the currency, Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, or Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System;

## **VII. INVESTMENT OF INTERIM MONIES AND CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT**

A. In addition to the authority provided in section VI of this policy, the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees may invest interim monies in certificates of deposit in accordance with all of the following:

1. The interim monies are initially deposited with an eligible public depository described in Section 135.03 of the Revised Code and selected, pursuant to Section 135.12 of the Revised Code by the Board of Trustees for interim monies of the Township;
2. The eligible public depository selected invest the interim monies in certificates of deposit of one or more federally insured banks or savings and loan associations, wherever located. The full amount of principal and any accrued interest of each certificate of deposit invested and pursuant to division (A)(2) of this section shall be insured by federal deposit insurance;
3. The eligible public depository selected shall act as custodian of the certificates of deposit;
4. At the same time that the eligible public depository selected invests the deposits received pursuant to that division and the certificates of deposit described in division (A)(2) and the certificates of deposit are issued by the bank or savings and loan association, the eligible public depository must receive an amount of deposits from customers of other federally insured financial institutions, wherever located, that are equal to or greater than the amount of interim monies initially deposited pursuant to division (A)(1) of this section

by the treasurer or governing board of a political subdivision;

5. Interim monies deposited or invested in accordance with division (A) of this section are not subject to any of the pledging requirements described in section 135.18 or 135.181 of the Revised Code.

## **VIII. INVESTMENT ADVISORY COMMITTEE**

The Investment Advisory Committee will be comprised of four (4) Township citizens and will be appointed by the Township Trustees to a four (4) year term. The Committee members may also serve on the Audit Committee. The Township shall provide Ethics training to a Committee member that meets the provisions in Section IV of this policy. The initial committee will be appointed so that one member will serve a one (1) year term, one member a two (2) year term, one member a three (3) year term and the fourth member a four (4) year term. Thereafter, each member will be appointed for a four (4) year term. One member of the Committee will be appointed annually by the Board of Trustees. Vacancies will be filled by the Board of Trustees for the unexpired term.

The Investment Advisory Committee shall meet semi-annually to review the portfolio in terms of security, type, risk, and investment return. As the Committee deems necessary other parties may be invited to attend as well, ~~excluding Beaver Creek Township Trustees.~~

The Fiscal Office shall make available an investment report at least quarterly that provides an overview of the current investment portfolio and the individual transactions executed over the last quarter or year to date. The report shall meet all the provisions listed in Section XIII.

The Committee, on an annual basis, shall review this Policy and the Township's investment practices and make recommendations on the investment practices to the Township Board of Trustees. The policies as stated herein may be changed only by the Township Board of Trustees.

## **IX. INVESTMENT ADVISOR**

In making investments authorized by this policy, the Fiscal Officer may retain the services of an investment adviser, provided the adviser is licensed by the Division of Securities under Section 1707.141 of the Revised Code or is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission, and possesses experience of public funds investment management, specifically in the area of state and local government investment portfolios,

or the adviser is an eligible institution mentioned in Section 135.03 of the Revised Code;

**X. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF INVESTMENT POLICY**

This written investment policy shall be signed by all entities conducting investment business with the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees. All brokers, dealers and financial institutions initiating transactions with the Fiscal Officer or Board of Trustees, by giving advice or making investment recommendations, shall sign this investment policy thereby acknowledging their agreement to abide by the policy's content. All brokers, dealers and financial institutions executing transactions initiated by the Fiscal Officer or the Board of Trustees having read this policy's contents, shall sign the investment policy thereby acknowledging their comprehension and receipt.

**XI. TRANSFER OF DEPOSITS FROM ONE CLASSIFICATION TO ANOTHER**

Whenever the Board of Trustees is of the opinion that the actual amount of active deposits is insufficient to meet the anticipated demands on such active deposits, it shall direct the Fiscal Officer to sell interim money investments or deposit or transfer from the inactive deposits to the active deposits in amounts sufficient to meet such demands. The Board of Trustees shall designate in such order the depositories from which withdrawals for such purposes shall be made and the amounts to be withdrawn from each. The Fiscal Officer shall then immediately give appropriate written notice of such withdrawals to each public depository affected thereby and at the expiration of the period of such notice shall make such withdrawals by presentation of certificates of deposit or otherwise in such a manner as the Board provides by appropriate regulations. In the case where there are two or more public depositories subject to such withdrawal, the Board shall make such withdrawals from the public depositories paying the lowest rate of interest and of proportional amounts as near as is practical.

**XII. SECURITY FOR REPAYMENT OF PUBLIC DEPOSITS**

The Fiscal Officer, before making the initial deposit in a public depository, shall require the institution designated as a public depository to pledge to and deposit with the Fiscal Officer as security for the repayment of all monies to be deposited in the public depository during the period of designation pursuant to the award, eligible securities of the type and of the amount specified in Section 135.18 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**XIII. REPORTING**

The Fiscal Officer shall maintain a current inventory of all investments which shall set forth the following information:

1. An accurate description of each security;
2. The cost of each security;
3. If applicable, par value of each security;
4. The date of the purchase, settlement and maturity of each security;
5. The rate of return for each security;
6. The identity of the seller of each security;
7. The location of each security.

The Fiscal Officer shall also prepare and distribute quarterly (or more frequently if requested by the Board of Trustees) a list of all investments and a report on investment activity and return.

## Local Government Safety Capital Grant Program Program Guidelines

### Background:

The Local Government Safety Capital Grant Program (the "Program") was created in Section 701.120 of Am. Sub. H.B. No. 64, 131st G.A. The Program was subsequently amended (to refine the definition of political subdivision) in Am. Sub. H.B. 340. The Program is administered by the Local Government Innovation Council (the "Council" and the facilitated by the Ohio Development Services Agency (the "Agency"). Grants awarded for the Program are made from the Local Government Safety Capital Fund, also created in Section 701.120.

### Purpose:

Grants funds are to be used for the purchase of vehicles, equipment, facilities, or systems needed to enhance Public Safety. The focus of the Local Government Safety Capital grants will be police, fire, and EMS-related purchases.

### Eligible applicants:

Eligible Applicants include political subdivisions as defined in Sec. 701.120 (C) of Am. Sub. H.B. 340.

"Political subdivision" means a **county, township, municipal corporation, joint emergency medical services district** organized under section 307.052 of the Revised Code, **fire district** organized under section 505.37 of the Revised Code, **joint fire district** organized under section 505.371 of the Revised Code, **fire and ambulance district** organized under section 505.375 of the Revised Code, **joint police district** organized under section 505.482 of the Revised Code, and **joint ambulance district** organized under section 505.71 of the Revised Code.

Political subdivisions that contract for police, fire, and/or EMS services are eligible to apply.

### Eligible Projects:

- An Eligible Project will be the purchase of vehicles, equipment, facilities, and/or systems that will be used by police, fire, and/or EMS providers to enhance public safety.
- The purchases must be owned by the Eligible Applicant.
- An Eligible Project may include more than one of these items, up to a total requested grant amount of \$100,000.

**Eligible expenses:**

- Grant funds may be used for the purchase of vehicles, equipment, facilities, or systems needed to enhance public safety.
- Grant funds are to be used primarily for hard costs associated with these purchases. Up to 5% of the grants funds may be used for soft costs, such as architectural and engineering fees, if needed.
- Grant funds may be used for training equipment/facilities, but not the training itself.
- Grant funds may not be used to pay for user fees or other operational costs.
- Grant funds may not be used to pay for costs incurred prior to the Eligible Applicant receiving approval by the Council.
- Grant funds may not be used as matching funds for other LGIF programs.

**Available Funds:**

\$10,000,000 is available for both FY16 and FY17. Grants shall be made from the Local Government Safety Capital Fund.

**Maximum award:**

The Council shall award not more than \$100,000 in total grants to an individual political subdivision per biennium. The Local Government Innovation Council, as defined in [ORC 189.03](#), is the final approver of grant awards.

Applications submitted by a group of political subdivisions which, if awarded, will serve to consolidate emergency services or enhance cooperation between or among the applying jurisdictions to more efficiently deliver emergency services are encouraged. An application submitted by multiple political subdivisions may seek a level of funding which does not exceed the collective total amount of funding which may be awarded to those political subdivisions individually, up to \$500,000.

**Application process:**

- Applications will be submitted online, and will be in the form determined by the Agency.
- Applicants will be asked to provide information on their jurisdiction, service area, operating budget, and economic need. They will also be required to provide a description and justification of their purchase, including itemized cost estimates from suppliers.
- If grant funds are provided for vehicles or facilities, the applicant must show that there are or will be resources available to service and maintain the vehicles or facilities.
- Prioritization will be given for multi-jurisdictional purchases that demonstrate sharing of services and collaboration.

**Scoring Methodology:**

Awards will be made based primarily on the following criteria that will be prioritized in the scoring process:

- Collaboration/shared services
- Purchase being recommended by a plan or study
- Greater cash match
- Greater overall need as evidenced by relationship between budget, number of incidents/crime stats, service area, staff, etc. as well as need-related metrics (unemployment and AML/poverty levels in community(ies) served)
- Greater need for specific item as evidenced in narrative and inventory
- Ability to support ongoing costs of purchase over time

**Grant Period:**

- Grant awards will be effective for one year from the date of Council approval (the "Grant Period"). All costs must be incurred within the Grant Period.
- Grant funds cannot be used to pay for costs incurred prior to the date the application was approved by the Council.

**Disbursements:**

- Disbursements will be made on a reimbursement basis. The grantee will be required to submit proof of payment indicating the purchase was made before being reimbursed.
- Multiple reimbursement requests throughout the Grant Period are allowed. However, requests for reimbursement must be a minimum of \$10,000, excluding the final request for reimbursement.
- Requests for reimbursement will be accepted up to 60 days after the end of the Grant Period.
- If the grantee has not requested reimbursement of the remaining grants funds within 60 days after the end of the Grant Period, the grantee will be given written notice that the funds will be disencumbered, and the grant will be closed.

**Closeout:**

- A grant closeout report will be required with the request for final disbursement.
- The closeout report will be in the form determined by the Agency, and will include information including but not limited to the purchase that was made with the grant funds, the total cost, any funds not used, and the impact that the purchase has had or will have on the grantee's operations.

**Proposed Timeline for awards:**

- Application open: February 16, 2016
- Application deadline: March 21, 2016
- Review period: March - May 2016
- Awards made: May 19, 2016 (Council meeting)

**Definitions:**

- Eligible Applicant – Political subdivisions as defined in Sec. 701.120 (C) of Am. Sub. H.B. 340. Political subdivisions that contract for police, fire, and/or EMS services are Eligible Applicants.
- Eligible Project – Purchases of vehicles, equipment, facilities, and/or systems that will be used by police, fire, and/or EMS providers to enhance public safety. The purchases must be owned by the Eligible Applicant. The Eligible Project may include more than one of these items, up to a total requested grant amount of \$100,000.
- Public Safety – The welfare and protection of the general public. For the purposes of the Local Government Safety Capital Grant Program, public safety refers specifically to fire, police, and EMS protection.
- System - A group of devices or objects forming a network for communication, travel, or distribution

- Equipment - Necessary items, such as supplies or tools, need for a specific purpose
  - *Examples include clothing/protective gear, radios or other communication devices, video cameras, ropes/tools/hoses, AED, monitors, etc.*
- Vehicle - A device or structure that transports people or objects
  - *Examples include cars, trucks, ambulances, bikes, motorcycles, unmanned aerial systems*

The entities listed above may collectively be referred to as the parties to this MOU.

**I. PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this MOU is to document a framework of cooperation to address the purchase and deployment of a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) vehicle to benefit the taxpayers of Beavercreek Township and Greene County.

The 131<sup>st</sup> Ohio General Assembly created the Local Government Safety Capital Grant Program through Amended Substitute H.B. 64 to award grants to political subdivisions to be used for the purchase of vehicles needed to enhance public safety.

Greene County and Beavercreek Township have jointly trained and outfitted 38 active members on the FEMA-registered Beavercreek Township CERT team, who are available to respond to Township, County or State level disasters to assist other citizens or support emergency response agencies.

Greene County Commissioners and Beavercreek Township agree in accordance with this MOU to assist with the purchase and deployment of a CERT response vehicle in Greene County, Ohio.

**II. STATEMENT OF MUTUAL BENEFIT AND INTEREST:**

The parties to this MOU have individual and collectively agreed that this MOU is beneficial to Greene County and Beavercreek Township.

Beavercreek Township agrees to

- Create a specification and appropriate matching funds to the total grant award in an amount not to exceed \$30,000.00 towards the purchase of a CERT response vehicle; and
- Commit \$100,000.00 in Local Government Safety Capital Grant awards to the purchase of a CERT response vehicle; and
- Insure and maintain the CERT response vehicle; and
- Deploy and operate the vehicle when requested to a declared Township or County disaster, or

otherwise requested by the County Administrator or CountyEMA Director.

Greene County agrees to

- Provide access to training materials and props; and
- Commit \$100,000.00 in Local Government Safety Capital Grant awards to the purchase of a CERT response vehicle.

The parties agree that it is to their mutual benefit and interest to work cooperatively to purchase and deploy a CERT response vehicle to support citizens and emergency response agencies in the event of a declared disaster.

### **III. EACH PARTY SHALL:**

- A. Agree to establish this MOU.
- B. Agree to the specification, purchase, insuring, maintenance and operation of a CERT vehicle by Beaver Creek Township.
- C. Designate a key contact or a representative to communicate with each other.
- D. Work through their key contact representative to provide necessary information to:
  - Revise or delete the Exhibits to this MOU;
  - Review status of the vehicle on an as-needed basis;
- E. Recognize that each party to this MOU retains primary responsibility and management discretion for their personnel.
- F. Agree to coordinate priorities.

### **IV. IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:**

- A. PRINCIPAL CONTACTS. The principal contacts for this MOU are: Rosanne Anders: Greene County Emergency Management Director and Township Public Safety Director Alex Zaharieff.
- B. FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT (FOIA). This MOU is subject to the Freedom of Information Act (5 U.S.C. 552).
- C. PARTICIPATION IN SIMILAR ACTIVITIES. This MOU in no way restricts the parties from participating in similar activities with other public or private agencies, organizations, and individuals.
- D. MODIFICATION. Modifications within the scope of this MOU shall be made by mutual consent of the parties, by the issuance of a written modification, signed and dated by all parties, prior to any changes being performed.

E. **TERMINATION.** Any party, in writing, may terminate their participation in this MOU in whole, or in part, at any time with 30-day written notice.




**REVENUE PROJECTIONS**

1) **Request Special Meeting for Firefighter Hiring**

1.1) The fire department is requesting a special Board of Trustees' meeting for the purpose of hiring a firefighter to fill the vacant position created by the terminal leave and pending retirement of Lt. Mallonee.

2) **Purchase Request for thermal imaging cameras' upgrades**

2.1) The fire department is requesting approval to upgrade two thermal imaging cameras (TICs) for a total cost of \$10,050.00.

2.2) This request fills an immediate need through the repair of a non-functioning unit.

2.3) TIC's are part of the fire department's apparatus inventory.

2.4) Cost Center/Program Area: **Suppression** (5710)

2.5) *This request is identical to the request approved by the Board at the 2016-08-31 meeting (Resolution #2015-326).*

In 2015, the fire department continued to evaluate options for life cycle management of its thermal 7 thermal imaging cameras. When purchased new, the cameras that meet our approved specifications cost between \$10,000.00 and \$15,000.00. Last year, our current camera manufacturer, ISG, offered the opportunity to refurbish and upgrade our existing cameras at a cost of \$5,025.00 each. This program replaced the components of the camera with current technology and this upgrade will extended the expected life span of the camera by 100% from 5-7 years to 10-14 years total life span. The program offered from ISG ends in 2016 and these are the only two remaining cameras eligible for this upgrade process in our inventory.

The fire department owns 7 TIC's, only 4 of which are eligible for this option. This purchase will complete the upgrade and refurbishment for those 4 units.

- 3.2) This request does not fill an operational need, but will improve service delivery through more efficient and effective use of existing resources.
- 3.3) Greater Miami Valley Emergency Medical Service Council (GMVEMSC) protocols reference 2010 American Heart Association (AHA) guidelines which require care providers to limit interruptions in chest compressions to less than 10 seconds. Additionally 2015 AHA guidelines emphasize the use of mechanical chest compression devices **when limited resources are available, in moving ambulances**, and for incidents with difficult access to the patient. (emphasis added)

- 3.5) CPR is a physically demanding skill that a normal person can usually provide effectively for 10-15 minutes per AHA studies. Additionally, patients in cardiac arrest are often found in places with limited access such as bathrooms and bedrooms. In order to provide for the best care, cardiac arrest incidents are manpower intensive, with crew members often rotating through the CPR provider position while 5-6 fire department responders are dispatched on cardiac arrest incidents; there is often not enough room for adequate access to the patient by multiple responders. Continuation of care, specifically CPR is paramount while moving a patient to a more accessible area as referenced in GMVEMSC protocols. This device will allow responders to



move the patient without interrupting CPR and even provide CPR in spaces where responders would have difficulty providing care.

Additionally, providing care in the rear of a moving medic is a challenging environment. This device will not only become a force multiplier allowing a provider to be available for other interventions, but also increase patient safety by limiting the rotation of crew members through tasks, allowing them to remain focused on their assigned area of patient care. Limiting movement of providers in the medic also increases their safety by providing a more conducive environment for seatbelt use while moving and providing patient care.

This purchase will place one Lucas chest compression system on all four primary in service medic units or ALS engines.

- 4.3) GIS training: The Fire Chief provided initial GIS training to the zoning department, including access to the software, basic concepts and uses and existing GIS data resources.
- 4.4) Greene County EMA Communications meeting: An Ohio MARCS update briefing was provided to detail information regarding current Greene County system status, an update regarding Montgomery County's upgrade, and information about the Ohio MARCS/Beavercreek LTE pilot and FirstNet.
- 4.5) LEAN Ohio: The Township Administrator and Fire Chief met with Clark State to discuss LEAN Ohio grant funding opportunities, including Township staff LEAN (Six Sigma tools) training and the Ohio Safety Capital Grant program.
- 4.6) Energy Audit: The fire department met with the maintenance department to discuss the results of the recent energy audits and review a planned conversion to LED lighting for fire department facilities.
- 4.7) Labor-Management: Administration and the Union met to discuss issues of mutual interest and concern, including new fire department work rules, proposed overtime MOU and current grievances.
- 4.8) Healthy Heroes: Interested firefighters performed baseline evaluations to determine baseline physical capabilities for fire service specific programming of exercises that can be completed by on-duty crews with equipment currently available in the fire stations.
- 4.9) Annual Standing Orders Testing: EMS certified firefighters participated in annual protocol recertification testing.
- 4.10) Ice rescue training: The fire department completed ice rescue practical skills check-offs at Phillips Pond.
