


REVENUE PROJECTIONS



III. Proposed Scope of Work Overview

The lighting system operating in the Beavercreek Township facilities surveyed in January, 2016 revealed an assortment of lighting technologies ranging from newer T8 fixtures to less efficient incandescent fixtures and HID fixtures on the building exteriors.

The hours of operation have been assumed for each individual space based on data collected from numerous other buildings and general observations made during the survey process. Our energy calculations are based on utility information also provided to us by building staff and have been used to calculate the existing and proposed energy costs.

As verification, it must be tested quarterly by an accredited testing laboratory. This contract will provide that testing and associated maintenance, including necessary filter replacement.

3) Biweekly Activity Report

- 3.1) Open Staff Meeting:** The fire department held its monthly, open staff meeting to discuss items of interest and concern, including: QC review processes, mobile computing issues related to vehicle MDT's, LTE evaluation update, Blue Card training, EMS field reporting, and SCBA challenge.
- 3.2) Labor-Management Mediation:** The Township Administrator and Fire Chief met with Union officials and a State Mediator in an attempt to resolve 3 grievances. Future steps in regards to those grievances will be determined by the Union-and if advanced, will be forwarded to the Board for consideration.
- 3.3) Greene County Fire Chiefs Meeting:** Beaver Creek Township hosted the April Greene County Fire Chiefs' meeting. Items discussed included developing a county-wide approach to dealing with emergency access points. BTFD will propose language to be jointly adopted and forwarded to Regional Planning for inclusion in future subdivision regulation updates.
- 3.4) UPCOMING EVENT Old Timers Breakfast:** The fifth annual Old Timers Breakfast will be held Saturday, May 21 from 08:00 to 11:00. Sponsored by the Honors Committee, this event recognizes the contributions of former volunteers and employees and provides an opportunity for current members to learn about the department's history by those who created it.

An inventory of known existing routes is being completed, and recommendations based upon those routes will be presented to the Board in a future meeting.
- 3.8) Lucas Device Deployment:** The Lucas Devices have been deployed following successful in-service training of fire department employees and Soin ED staff. The device has already been used during a cardiac arrest.
- 3.9) Auxiliary Training:** Ten members of the fire department Auxiliary CERT team participated in a joint training exercise with Germantown, Mason and Brookville CERT teams and the Ohio Military Reserve. The training included land navigation, helicopter landing zone operations, and search and rescue.
- 3.10) FDIC:** Program managers for SCBA, Haz-Mat, fire gear, suppression, and technical rescue attended the FDIC trade show to research current trends and offerings for equipment and services to support fire department operational goals and objectives. They attended one-day and used fire department transportation to minimize costs.






