LEGAL NOTICE OF TWO (2) SPECIAL MEETINGS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HOLDING TWO (2) PUBLIC HEARINGS TO CONSIDER THE LEVY OF AN ANNUAL MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE TAX PURSUANT TO ORC § 4504.18

The Beavercreek Township Board of Trustees will hold two (2) special meetings with the purpose of holding two (2) public hearings to consider the levy of an annual motor vehicle license tax, pursuant to ORC § 4504.18, upon the operation of motor vehicles on the public roads and highways in the unincorporated area of Beavercreek Township. The tax shall be at the rate of five dollars (\$5.00) annually per motor vehicle, on all motor vehicles, the owners of which reside in the unincorporated area of Beavercreek Township.

The special meetings and hearings will be held on **Monday, November 7, 2016, at 7:00 PM** and on **Monday, November 21, 2016, at 7:00 PM** in the Community Room Lower Level of Fire Station #61, 2195 Dayton-Xenia Road, Beavercreek, Ohio 45434.

Vehicle Registration Permissive Tax FAQs For County, Municipality and Township Officials

What is “vehicle registration permissive tax?”

“Vehicle registration permissive tax “(hereinafter referred to as “permissive tax”) is an optional tax that can be levied by counties and/or taxing districts on vehicle registrations. It is defined in Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Chapter 4504: Local Motor Vehicle License Tax. There are eight \$5.00 levies that are available to be enacted, but only four can be in effect at any one time in any single taxing district.

Permissive tax revenue is to be used by the counties and taxing districts per ORC Chapter 4504, which includes planning, constructing, improving maintaining and repairing public roads, highways, streets, and for the maintaining and repair of bridges and viaducts.

What is a “taxing district?”

A taxing district is either a township or a municipality (incorporated village or city).

How is a levy enacted?

Counties, municipalities and townships pass a resolution/ordinance per ORC. Once the resolution/ordinance has been passed, a copy is sent to the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles Tax Distribution Section by July 1 to be effective the following registration year (ORC section 4504.08).

For a sample resolution/ordinance, or for additional information, please contact the Tax Distribution Section (see below).

How do we find out if our taxing district has already enacted all levies allowed?

The current Taxing District Code Book is published on the BMV website at: <http://www.publicsafety.ohio.gov/links/Taxing-District-Code-Book.pdf>.

This publication lists all the taxing districts within each county and the current permissive tax rates. The maximum permissive tax in any single taxing district is \$20.00 per registration per registration year. If \$20.00 is the listed rate for a taxing district, no new permissive tax levies can be enacted for that taxing district. Please contact the Tax Distribution Section for additional information.

Counties have the option of enacting levies under ORC sections 4504.02, 4504.15 and 4504.16. Enacting these levies is contingent on the respective municipal levies of 4504.06, 4504.17 and 4504.171. For example, if City X in County Y has already enacted 4504.06, then County Y now levying 4504.02 will not be able to collect permissive tax from vehicle registrations of the residents of City X under 4504.02.

Municipalities have the option of enacting levies under ORC sections 4504.06, 4504.17, 4504.171 and 4504.172. Enacting 4504.06, 4504.17, and 4504.171 are contingent on the respective county levies 4504.02, 4504.15 and 4504.16. For example, if County X has enacted 4504.02, then City Y cannot enact 4504.06. ORC 4504.172 is not contingent on any other levy, so a municipality can pass an ordinance at any time to enact this.

Townships have the option of enacting a levy under ORC section 4504.18. ORC 4504.18 is not contingent on any other levy, so a township can pass a resolution at any time to enact this.

How much of the permissive tax does the county/taxing district receive for each of the levies?

The percentage each county/taxing district receives in permissive tax depends on which levies are enacted in that county/taxing district. Please refer to the following charts:

County Levies

ORC Section	Amount	Distribution Rules
4504.02	\$ 5.00	100% of the revenue collected is distributed to the county (Municipalities can request from the county a portion of this revenue, per the Ohio Revised Code) (Counties have the authority to enact this tax at any time, however cannot collect revenue from municipalities already enacting 4504.06)
4504.15	\$ 5.00	If a municipal registration: 50% to the municipality, 50% to the county If a township registration: 30% to the township, 70% to the county. (Counties have the authority to enact this tax at any time, however cannot collect revenue from municipalities already enacting 4504.17)
4504.16*	\$ 5.00	If a municipal registration: 100% is distributed to the county If a township registration: 30% to the township, 70% to the county. (*Effective January 2002, 4504.051 allows an increase or decrease in the allocation to townships by passage of a resolution and county approval.) (Counties have the authority to enact this tax at any time, however cannot collect revenue from municipalities already enacting 4504.171)

4504.171	\$ 5.00	100% to the municipality (Municipalities cannot enact this tax if the County is already enacting 4504.16)
4504.172	\$ 5.00	100% to the municipality (Municipalities have the authority to enact this tax at any time)

A RESOLUTION TO ENACT A TOWNSHIP PERMISSIVE MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE TAX PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE 4504.18

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of Beaver Creek Township, Greene County, Ohio, recognize the importance of maintaining township roads and that the funds available for road maintenance remain stagnant while the cost of road maintenance is increasing; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code 4504.18 allows the Board of Trustees to levy an annual license tax upon the operation of motor vehicles on the public roads and highways in the "unincorporated territory" of the township for the purpose of paying for the construction, reconstruction, improvement, maintenance, and repair of township roads, bridges, and culverts; the costs and expenses of enforcing and administering the license plate tax; for purchasing, erecting, and maintaining traffic signs, markers, lights, and signals; for purchasing road machinery and equipment; and for planning, constructing, and maintaining suitable buildings to house road equipment; and

WHEREAS, per Ohio Revised Code 4504.18, public notifications were published in the Dayton Daily News on October 23, 2016 announcing two public hearings which were held on November 7, 2016, and November 21, 2016 to provide information and accept comments about a proposed \$5.00 permissive motor vehicle license tax (additional township license tax); and

WHEREAS, ## residents from the Township appeared at the November 7, 2016 hearing and ## residents appeared at the November 21, 2016 hearing to voice their concerns and have their questions addressed and answered by the Board of Trustees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF BEAVERCREEK TOWNSHIP, GREENE COUNTY, OHIO THAT:

Section 1. Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 4504.18, an annual license tax is levied upon the operation of motor vehicles on the public roads and highways in the registration district know as the unincorporated area of Beaver Creek Township, Greene County, Ohio.

Section 2. Such tax shall be levied at a rate of five dollars and zero cents (\$5.00) per motor vehicle on all motor vehicles the owners of which reside in the registration district know as the unincorporated area of Beavercreek Township, Greene County, Ohio.

Section 3. The intent of this Resolution is to levy the full tax a township is allowed to annually levy under Ohio Revised Code 4504.18.

Section 4: The Board of Trustees of Beavercreek Township, Greene County, Ohio, will enact a \$5.00 permissive motor vehicle license tax which will take effect 30 days after adoption of this Resolution as the earliest date allowed by law.

Section 5: All revenues realized by Beavercreek Township, Greene County, Ohio, pursuant to the Resolution is used only for the purpose allowed under Ohio Revised Code 4504.18.

Section 6: That this Board of Trustees hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.



PERMITS: Only one single-family dwelling permit was issued in this period. Other permits issued were for: three decks, two accessory sheds and one accessory detached garage. Also, three Parks Permits were issued. Last year, we issued the 83rd house permit on Nov. 6th. This year to date we have a 9% increase over 2015 in single-family dwelling permits (83 vs. 76), and a 16% increase in total Zoning actions (274 vs. 237), not counting Parks Permits.

The following chart compares numbers of Zoning Permits issued for the last six years. Numbers through 2015 are totals for each year. 2016 numbers are year-to-date, through October 19. The revenue line is the amount generated by Zoning Department fees.




REVENUE PROJECTIONS

RIGHT TO USE AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is by and between the Board of Trustees of Beaver Creek Township, 851 Orchard Lane Suite C, Beaver Creek, Ohio 45434 ("Township") and the Beaver Creek Historical Society ("Tenant").

1. The Township hereby provides to Tenant the right to use the west side ("the space") of the structure known as the "The Township Building". The Tenant shall use the space solely as office space for its own use.

2. This Agreement shall be for a period of one (1) year commencing on the 1 day of December, 2016 and terminating on the 30 day of November, 2017. There shall be no rental payments paid by the Tenant to the Township, but the Township shall receive a Maintenance Fee from the Tenant as set forth in Item 11.

3. Either party may terminate said Agreement during the original term or any renewal thereof upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party.

4. During the terms of said Agreement or any renewal thereof, the Township shall maintain the exterior of the "The Township Building". The Township shall also pay for all charges for gas, electricity, water and sewer used by the Tenant. The Tenant shall provide for and be solely responsible for the removal and disposal of its trash and shall pay for all custodial services for the space. The Tenant may use the Township's dumpster at no cost.

5. The Tenant shall keep the space in good repair, reasonable wear and tear excepted. The Tenant shall be responsible for all cleaning, janitorial services and interior maintenance of the space. The Township shall be responsible for the maintenance of the HVAC system servicing the space as well as the exterior of the "The Township Building" (except for the repairs necessitated by the Tenant's negligent use of the space) including the removal of snow on the parking lot.

6. The Tenant shall not alter or improve the space without the prior written consent of the Township and any and all alterations, improvements, additions and fixtures made or placed on or in the space shall, on expiration or sooner termination of this Agreement, belong to the Township without compensation to the Tenant.

7. The Tenant shall not assign this Agreement nor sublet any portion of the space without the prior written consent of the Township.

8. During the period of this Agreement the Township shall be permitted access to the space. The Tenant shall provide the Township Fiscal Officer with one key to access the space for emergency purposes.

9. All notices required under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed to have been duly given if they are delivered personally, transmitted via telecopy or transmission, followed by telephone confirmation of receipt, or mailed by overnight, express mail delivery services as follows:

10. Any of the Tenant's personal property remaining in the structure following termination of this Agreement shall be conclusively presumed to have been abandoned by the Tenant and the Township shall have the right to dispose of the personal property in any manner without regard to the preservation of any value.

11. The Tenant shall reimburse the Township \$140.00 each month for expenses incurred by the Township in maintaining the "The Township Building". Said reimbursement shall be paid to the Township on the first day of each month.

12. The Township shall maintain fire and extended insurance on the "The Township Building" including the space. Each party shall carry its own liability insurance with respect to the space. The Tenant shall secure and pay for a policy of comprehensive general liability insurance with single limit coverage of not less than \$1 million naming the Township as an additional insured. On the commencement date and on each subsequent insurance renewal date, if any, Tenant shall deliver to the Township suitable certificates evidencing this insurance.

13. Each party shall carry its own insurance with respect to the contents of the property and shall indemnify and hold harmless the other party from any and all claims for the losses associated with the personal property of the other.

14. The Tenant covenants and warrants to the Township as follows:

A. Tenant warrants that it will use the space for only the stated purpose;

- B. That it will not permit the sale, service or consumption of alcoholic beverages or controlled substances in the space and that it will keep the space free of nuisance.
- C. Tenant shall assume the risk of, be responsible for and have the obligation to ensure against and indemnify Township and hold it harmless from any and all liability, claims, demands, actions, damages, costs and expenses arising from or connected with any loss or damages or injury to persons (including death resulting therefrom) or property occurring in, on or about the space except for that caused by the negligence or willful act of the Township or its employees, agents or servants; and Tenant hereby releases the Township from any and all liability for the same.






